Guanajuato is the state capital, founded in 1570, and a World Heritage Site. It is a mining that city offers panoramic extraordinary views due to its topography among hills, beautiful alleys full of color, tunnels, subway streets. iconic mummies. colonial-style architecture. etc. In addition, it is one of the main scenarios of the struggle for Independence, which makes it a place with sites of great historical and cultural importance.

San Miguel de Allende is a World Cultural Heritage destination. A colonial jewel with a relaxed and bohemian cultural atmosphere; a small town full of first-class restaurants, luxury hotels, and exclusive boutiques, but also local businesses, plazas, and colorful streets full of history and traditions.

Nearby there are attractions such as the Sanctuary of Atotonilco also a World Cultural Heritage Site, a Novo-Hispanic temple that stands out for its 18th-century murals and architectural details, which recognizes it as the Sistine Chapel of America.
